### Help with completing your application for a scrap metal dealer licence

#### Section 1 – For everyone

This section asks if you are applying for a collector's licence or a site licence. You may only apply for one type of licence in each council area, but you can apply to run multiple sites. For instance, you could apply to run 3 sites in council A's area, and also apply to be a collector in council B's area.

A **site licence** allows you to transport scrap metal to and from the site from any local authority area. It also allows you to buy and sell scrap metal from fixed location(s) within the council area.

A **collector's licence** allows you to travel within the council area to collect scrap metal. You may not take this metal back to a site that you run within the council area in order to sell it.

#### **Tax Conditionality**

Schedule 23 to Finance Act 2011 (Data Gathering Powers) and Schedule 36 to Finance Act 2008 (Information and Inspection Powers), grant HMRC powers to obtain relevant information from third parties. This includes licensing bodies being required to provide information about licence applicants.

Renewal Applications Only:

From 4 April 2022, if you are renewing your existing licence then you are required to undertake a Tax Conditionality Check.

You are able to do this online through a digital service on the HMRC website.

You'll need to complete a tax check if you're:

- Renewing a licence
- Applying for the same type of licence you previously held, that ceased being valid less than a year ago
- Applying for the same type of licence you already hold with another licensing authority You must carry out the tax check yourself. You cannot ask a tax agent or adviser to do this on your behalf. The tax check will ask questions about how you pay any tax that may be due on income you earn from your licensed trade. After you have completed the tax check you will be given a 9-character tax check code.

#### New Applications Only:

From 4 April 2022, first-time applicants must give confirmation that they are aware of the guidance about their tax obligations. If the applicant is a partner in a partnership, they can give confirmation on behalf of all the other partners. ### Section 2 – For everyone

In order to carry on your business you may need to hold other environmental permits or licences that we should know about. For instance, if you carry waste as part of your business it is a legal requirement to register as a waste carrier. This includes transporting waste while travelling from job to job, to a storage place for disposal later, or to a waste disposal company or waste site. ### Section 3 – For site licences

Fill out this section if you want a **site licence**. It should be filled out in the name of the person who will hold the scrap metal dealer's licence. As well as details about you and your business, we will also need details of any directors, shadow directors, company secretary or partners involved in the business including their home address.

We also want to know if you operate or propose to operate a site in another local authority area, along with details of this site, the council which has licensed it or to whom you have applied for a licence.

If your site(s) were established after 1990, then you are required to have planning permission from the council. You will need to tell us if this is the case, and it will be checked with the council planning department.

#### Section 4 – For a collector's licence

Fill out this section if you want a **collector's licence**. It should be filled out in the name of the person who will hold the scrap metal dealer's licence. You are asked to provide contact details, including the place where you live, so that the council can get in touch with you if necessary.

You need to submit a Basic Disclosure Certificate. This is because the Home Office has decided that you need to tell the council if you have been convicted of certain crimes. Possessing a conviction may not automatically prevent you from having a licence if the offence was unrelated to being a scrap metal, if the offence was unrelated to being a scrap metal dealer or a long time ago, and you can convince the council that you are a suitable person. If you operate as a business partnership or company then these checks also apply to any business partners, company directors, shadow directors or company secretary associated with your business. A Basic Disclosure Certificate is considered to be only valid for a limited time, but can be used to apply to as many councils as you want within that time. Typically, three months is the longest that you can expect your check to be considered valid. Buckinghamshire Council require the certificate to be no less than one month old. We also ask for the place where you will store any collected scrap metal before taking it to a licensed site to dispose of it. Note that you are not allowed to sell or buy metal at this storage site and doing so is an offence. This may be a licensed site that you operate in another council area.

You will need to ensure that all your vehicles are roadworthy and are properly taxed, insured and otherwise meet the legal requirements to be on the road.

#### Section 5 – Motor salvage operator

This section asks if you will be salvaging motor vehicles as part of your work. The Scrap Metal Dealers Act 2013 brings together the Scrap Metal Dealers Act 1964 together with Part 1 of the Vehicles (Crime) Act 2001, which means you now only need a scrap metal dealer's licence.

### Section 6 – Bank accounts that will be used for payments to suppliers

This section asks you for the bank details which you will use to pay people for the scrap metal you receive or sell. This is to check that you are not selling the metal for cash, which is illegal. These details will be kept securely by the council.

### Section 7 - Payment

There is a fee that needs to be paid in order for a complete application to be made for a licence. These fees are available to view on the website <a href="www.buckinghamshire.gov.uk">www.buckinghamshire.gov.uk</a>. The fee reflects the costs of processing the form and checking that people are doing what the licence requires. Applications cannot be accepted unless the correct fee has been paid.

### Section 8 - Criminal convictions

This section asks you to set out any relevant convictions or enforcement activity that has been undertaken against you by the Environment Agency or Natural Resources Wales. It is an offence under the Scrap Metal Dealers Act 2013 to make or recklessly make a false statement. The information listed here will be checked against the Basic Disclosure Certificate that you are required to submit with the application, along with information retained by the police and the Environment Agency or Natural Resources Wales.

#### Section 9 - Declaration

The person who will hold the scrap metal dealer's licence needs to sign and date the declaration, as do the other people named on the form. This section also explains that the council has to share some of these details with the police and Environment Agency when checking whether the applicant(s) is a suitable person to hold a licence. Some of the information will also be displayed on a public register.

If you do not agree to this use of your information then you should **not** sign the form. If you are in any doubt about what this section means then speak to your council's licensing team.

### **Relevant offences**

The Government requires that local authorities make sure that they only issue scrap metal dealers licences to those considered to be 'suitable persons'. The Scrap Metal Dealers Act 2013 (Prescribed Relevant Offences and Relevant Enforcement Action) Regulations 2013 provides a list of the offences which local authorities are obliged to take into account when considering if an applicant is a suitable person.

The local authority will consider convictions for any of the following relevant offences and relevant enforcement actions:

- (d) An offence under sections 33, 34 or 34B of the Environmental Protection Act 1990(4)
- (e) An offence under section 9 of the Food and Environment Protection Act 1985(5)
- (f) An offence under section 1 of the Fraud Act 2006(6), where the specific offence concerned relates to scrap metal, or is an environment-related offence
- (g) An offence under section 146 of the Legal Aid, Sentencing and Punishment of Offenders Act 2012(7)
- (h) An offence under sections 327, 328 or 330 to 332 of the Proceeds of Crime Act 2002(8)
- (i) Any offence under the Scrap Metal Dealers Act 1964(9)
- (j) Any offence under the Scrap Metal Dealers Act 2013
- (k) An offence under sections 1, 8,9,10, 11, 17, 18, 22 or 25 of the Theft Act 1968(10), where the specific offence concerned relates to scrap metal, or is an environment-related offence
- (I) Any offence under Part 1 of the Vehicles (Crime) Act 2001(11)
- (m) An offence under sections 85, 202, or 206 of the Water Resources Act 1991(12).
